## ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY RADIO LAUNCHED

Alagappa University Community Radio was commissioned on 26th January 2021 on the momentous occasion of India's 72nd Republic Day by the Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu and Chancellor of Alagappa University Thiru. Banwarilal Purohit through virtual mode. In his inaugural address, the Governor said that community radio is a world-wide phenomenon today. It provides space for the local community to meet and collaborate and articulate their ideas and views for the betterment of the society. It would also help to carry the Central and State Governments welfare measures and development plans to the doorsteps of the marginalized people. It would also help in documenting the unique cultural traditions of the local community and would also help in their social and economic activities. As on 31st December 2020 India had 310 Community Radio Stations and more than 40 community radio stations are functioning in Tamil Nadu. In fact, Tamil Nadu State is not only a pioneer but also it is keeping its record. The Governor commended the University for this enterprise .



While offering felicitation at the function arranged through virtual mode, the Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education Thiru. K.P.Anbalagan stated that Alagappa University is the second university in Tamil Nadu to launch the community radio which would act as a bridge between the local community and the University. Speaking on the occasion

the Hon'ble Minister for Khadi and Village Industries G. Baskaran said that the launching of Alagappa University community radio would help the rural community of Sivagangai District and lauded the authorities of the University for this venture .

Prof. N.Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, in his felicitation address, said that launching of the community radio under RUSA 2.0 Scheme is yet another milestone in the annals of Alagappa University. He added that a University is not an island and it is connected with the society and launching of Alagappa University Community Radio would make this link closer by bringing people to the University. The founder's dream of establishing a world class institution is being realized step by step by various noteworthy improvements and additions made to the academic ambience of Alagappa University. The contents that are useful and relevant to the region are to be decided by the local community; and that pragmatic approach will be beneficial to the people. In fact, it will provide a forum for the ordinary people to voice their views on matters of social importance. He concluded his speech by thanking the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting for sanctioning the Community Radio and the Department of Communication, Government of India for its help in the founding process of this Community Radio Station in such a short time.

### ONE DAY RADIATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME AND 125TH YEAR CELEBRATION OF DISCOVERY OF X-RAY AND RADIOACTIVITY

Alagappa University, Karaikudi, in association with Indira Gandhi Centre for Atomic Research (IGCAR), Kalpakkam and Indian Association for Radiation Protection (IARP) Kalpakkam, conducted a One Day Radiation Awareness Programme and 125th year Celebration of Discovery of X-ray and Radioactivity on 03.03.2021 at the Science Campus of Alagappa University. Prof.C.Sekar, Head, Department of Bioelectronics & Biosensors, welcomed the gathering.

In his presidential address Prof.N.Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, stressed the need for and importance of nuclear energy for constructive purposes and he exhorted the science students to explore the importance of Radiation in fields such as industry medicine etc. Though it has many merits and a few demerits, it needs to be handled very carefully for human welfare. He recalled the impact of nuclear explosion that happened in Japan which resulted in the loss of many precious human lives. At the same time the benefits of X-Ray are enormous in saving human lives. He recalled the contributions of Indira Gandhi Centre for Atomic Research (IGCAR) Kalpakkam to the field of Advanced Engineering and Fast Breeder Reactor Technology. Further the Vice-Chancellor said that Physics, Chemistry and Biology are directly or indirectly involved in the field of Radiation. Students pursuing science education should be aware of the importance of Radiation and its benefits.

Dr. Venkataraman, a Distinguished Scientist & Director, IGCAR, delivered a speech



on the “History of Radioactivity and Societal Applications of Radiation”. He provided a glimpse of ionizing and non-ionizing radiations in Industry and Medicine and also emphasized the advantages of nuclear energy as the most efficient and cleanest source of energy. His presentation focused on the live examples. He presented a comparison of how a small quantity of nuclear fuel give enormous energy compared to coal, oil and natural gases, solar, wind or hydro power. He elaborated on the greatest advantage of using the nuclear fuel as the cleanest source of energy and the way it gives very less or minimum amount of toxic gases.



An exhibition arranged by a team of scientists from IGCAR at Alagappa University fascinated the students and they learnt about the research work done at IGCAR and also about the opportunities for employment and research in IGCAR. Further, the team of IGCAR also conducted a Quiz competition and other competitions like Slogan Writing, Drawing and Elocution to create awareness among the students on the use of radiation and to make them understand more about the benefits of radiation.

At the valedictory function, Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Singh, RUSACoordinator and Organizer of this programme, explained the fruitfulness of the programme. Prof. B. Vaseeharan, Registrar i/c delivered the felicitation address emphasizing the importance of this awareness programme and also expressed his thoughts on the benefits of radiation. Shri. P. Gopal,

State Organizing Secretary, Arivial Sangam, VIBHA Tamil Nadu, spoke about the salient features of the programme. Prof. G. Ravi, Head, Department of Physics, spoke on the occasion. The team from IGCAR awarded the winners of the competitions with mementoes, cash prizes, and certificates.

### [India International Science Festival IISF-2020](#)

#### **Curtain Raiser & Outreach Programme Conducted on the Theme “Science for Self Reliant India and Global Welfare”**

Alagappa University, conducted the “Curtain Raiser & Outreach Programme” on the theme “Science for Self Reliant India and Global Welfare” under the banner of India International Science Festival (IISF-2020) on 14.12.2020 through virtual platform. The main objective of this programme was to promote the role of Science & Technology in the current scenario and to create awareness on the significant role of science in promoting human welfare and health.

India International Science Festival is an annual celebration to promote science and technology and to demonstrate how science could make India a self-reliant nation. It is also organised to highlight the advancements in the field of science and technology and the contributions of students, innovators, craftsmen, farmers, scientists and technocrats from India and abroad.

Prof. N. Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, referred to the role played by Science & Technology in ancient Tamil Nadu and said that the historical imprints help us explore the abundant resources and the role played by science in the ancient times for the well being of the state. He emphasized the need to study the history of science especially, the western science and stated that science alone could create an egalitarian society. The great



Sagar (ocean) of Sciences is the result of great human minds. The origin and evolution of science also shows the growth of human mind and creativity. The Vice-Chancellor also stated that the combination of physics, mathematics & other related fields have contributed immensely to the scientific world. He also said that the “Curtain Raiser & Outreach Programme” organized in connection with the IISF 2020 is one of the first of its kind to be organised in the University.

Prof. Vishwa Mohan Katoch, Former Secretary DHR & Director General, ICMR. President of JIPMER, Pondicherry and All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Madurai, delivered the keynote address. In his address, he stated that the old civilization had been very rich and helped in developing innovations in science and added that more research should be carried out in the Science of Medicine. He elaborated on the available health services in India which is equitable and affordable and also referred to the milestones in the health mission. He said that India ranks second volume wise in global pharmaceutical sector, mainly in the manufacture of generics. India dominates the vaccine industry globally. India is emerging fast in biotech industry but does not have adequate strength in diagnostics. Prof. Katoch also underscored the importance of Child Health Research.

Shri. Jayant Sahasrabudhe, National Organising Secretary, Vijnana Bharathi (VIBHA), was the guest of honour. He said that the present situation has forced everyone across the world to find solutions that are essentially local. He lauded our Prime Minister, for giving a clarion call for ‘Atmanirbhar Bharat’ – a self-reliant India. Having recognized the vital role of science, technology and innovation in achieving self-reliance during this period of crisis, he said that the Indian S&T fraternity and all R&D institutions have responded swiftly and successfully to the call of the Prime Minister.

A total of about 500 students participated in the event through virtual platform. Prof. S. Karutha Pandian, Dean, Faculty of Science, Head, Department of Biotechnology, welcomed the participants. Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Singh, Nodal Officer-Alagappa University, in his vote of thanks highlighted the role of IISF in building the nation and explained the activities happening under IISF 2020. Thiru. P.Gopal Organising Secretary, VIBHA, Tamil Nadu, Thiru. B.Krishnamoorthy, President, VIBHA, Tamil Nadu, Thiru. P.Sabanayagam, Secretary, VIBHA, Tamil Nadu, were present on the occasion.

### TRIUNE CELEBRATIONS CONDUCTED TO MARK PONGAL FESTIVAL, THIRUVALLUVAR DAY AND TEACHERS DAY

A Triune Celebration to mark the Pongal Festival, Thiruvalluvar Day and Teachers Day was conducted in Alagappa University, on 12.01.2021 at the Convocation Auditorium.



In his presidential address Prof. N.Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, referred to the significance of celebrating the triune function and said it is done primarily to pay our gratitude to farmers and teachers in remembrance of their contribution to humanity. And equally important is the observance of Thiruvalluvar Day as Thiruvalluvar is a great teacher whose philosophy of life will eternally be relevant. Pongal is a festival that celebrates the fruits of labour and it reflects the quintessence of Tamil culture. Thirukkural with its ethical perspective



helps to understand the intra cultural milieu of the Tamils. He added that teaching is not a job but it is a way of life. The impact of teachers on shaping the individuals is immense.

He added that 'h-Index' of Alagappa University has risen to 84 as on date which points to the excellence in research. This, he attributed to the Theme Based Research Projects done under RUSA 2.0 Scheme . The teachers who contributed to the rise of 'H' index were honoured at the function.

Thavathiru. Kundrakudi Ponnambala Adigalar released the English Translation of Valluvam : The Philosophy of World Affirmation, a master critique on Thirukkural authored by the Former Vice-Chancellor of Madurai Kamaraj University Prof. V.Sp.Manickanar. The English translation has been done by an eminent scholar Dr. K. Chellappan, a Former Professor of English of Bharathidasan University. Adigalar also released the book Thee Nunmee (A Documentation of the Impact of the current Pandemic) containing, poems, stories and essays.

While delivering the special address on the occasion, Adigalar said that Thirukkural covering the entire gamut of human life in 1330 couplets addresses all mankind and its wisdom is not bound by time and space. The book Valluvam by Dr. V.Sp.Manickam dwells on Valluvar's ideology of world affirmation revealing the modern perspective by an in-depth interpretation of Kural couplets. The competent English translation rendered by Prof. K. Chellappan is a treasure to the world of knowledge. He said that ignorance is at the root cause of all evils and proper education is the solution for all problems. Swami Vivekananda, whose birthday falls today, emphasised the importance of science education for India's development. He added that teachers' crucial role in this regard cannot be ignored.

Nine University Teachers and one Senior System Programmer who have been serving

the University for 25 years without any blemish were honoured with certificates.

#### ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY TO OFFER ONLINE PROGRAMMES



It may be noted that Government of India announced in May 2020, that it would permit top 100 Universities in India to start Online Courses to keep pace with global developments in the education sector. Alagappa University with its credentials of 'A+' Grade (CGPA 3.64) given by NAAC in the third cycle of assessment and graded as Category-I University applied for permission to start online programme. It may also be recalled here that as part of the e-governance facilities under RUSA 2.0 scheme the University launched the Alagappa University Online Portal and it is functioning through the University Website.

Meanwhile, the UGC has granted permission to Alagappa University to start Online Programmes. For this purpose Alagappa University has established Alagappa



University Online Directorate (AUOLD) which was inaugurated by Vice-Chancellor Prof. N. Rajendran on 5th February 2021.

Vice-Chancellor Prof. N. Rajendran said that the Online Programmes provide “anytime, anywhere education experience”; and they have been designed with an objective of giving a boost to the careers of learners and helping them use their full potential for elevation. They are on a par with distance learning programmes. He added that industry-oriented teaching is to be done by corporate experts and also lectures are to be delivered by eminent faculty and these would be notable features of the online programme.

The Online Programmes include 3 UG and 10 PG programmes and they are as follows:

1.B.A. (Tamil) 2.B.Com 3.B.B.A. and the PG Programmes are 1.M.A. (Tamil) 2.M.A. (English) 3.M.A. (Journalism and Mass Communication) 4.M.Com 5.M.B.A. (General) 6. M.B.A. (Financial Management) 7. M.B.A. (Logistics Management) 8. M.B.A.(Tourism) 9. M.B.A. (Human Resource Management)

#### **SENIOR STAFF ATTEND HIGHER EDUCATION LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME**

The Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Prof.N.Rajendran congratulated and distributed Certificates to four staff members of Alagappa University who had attended Higher Education Leadership Development Programme.

The Higher Education Leadership Development (HELD) Programme was funded by the UK-India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) and delivered by Advance HE and the University Grants Commission (UGC) with support from the Ministry of Education India and British Council, UK.

The Programme aimed to build the administrative and leadership capacity of senior level staff across Indian Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) and to enable the participants to bring about systemic changes with renewed approaches, capacity, tools and skills in their HEIs. It was also intended to create and strengthen the sustainable relationship between UK and Indian HEIs and utilize the UK's expertise in the field of higher education administration and leadership.

The UGC had invited applications from the Universities in the country during February

2020 as face-to-face programme. Among the applications received, 67 Universities were selected and 247 members from these Universities were selected to participate. Due to COVID-19 situation, the programme was implemented by online mode.

Four members Dr.H.Gurumallesh Prabu, Dr.N.Rajakumar, Dr.S.Arun and SP.Geetha were the participants from Alagappa University. The participants attended the programme online during the period between 2nd November 2020 to 26th March 2021 operated through Zoom Online Meetings with virtual learning environment platform Brightspace provided by Advance HE, where resources and materials were shared.

Learning modules included Leadership & Change, Effective Managers & Leaders, Coaching Skills, Helping People through Change, Action Learning, Project Management Techniques, Communication & Stakeholder Engagement, Role of the Leadership Developer, Diversity & Inclusivity, Performance Management. Further, the participants took a Digitization as Change project. The University extended support in the form of manpower and machineries.

The participants received an extensive Leadership Training and gained knowledge in ideas / strategy in Leadership. The participants equipped themselves to train future leaders within and outside the University.

**SPECIAL LECTURE ON “HISTORY OF INDIAN SCIENCE” ORGANISED AS PART OF “INDIA INTERNATIONAL SCIENCE FESTIVAL**

Alagappa University organized a Special Lecture Programme on “History of Indian Science” in connection with “India International Science Festival” (IISF) on December 20th, 2020 through virtual mode to show India’s contribution to the field of science and create awareness among the youth of the country about Indian civilization and the imprints it has left across the globe. Prof. N. Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, said that the fascinating history of science demonstrates the ever active inventive genius of the human mind and man’s endeavours and innate potential to protect his

species from the onslaught of Nature.

In his special address, Prof. S. Sivasubramanian, Former Vice-chancellor, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, said that scientists of the world with an inner urge and curiosity have all along been trying to understand the way the world and the universe work and the result has been many inventions and discoveries that help humanity to lead a life of comfort, health and happiness. The history of science shows that these scientists pursued their craft not simply to get glory or material reward but to satisfy their quest for curiosity. Their curiosity led to innovations. He added that increasing awareness of scientific inventions over the years have added to the growth of culture and civilization.

Dr. D. K. Hari, Founder, Bharath Gyan, Chennai, in his keynote address, stated that “India has been noted for its scientific awareness and knowledge right from the Vedic period to modern times with the usual fluctuations that can be expected of any country.” Shri.V. ## FACULTY OF ARTS

### DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

#### Discourse on the Enigmatic World of Drama-Explained

The Department of English and Foreign Languages held a special discourse online on 5th February, 2021 on “The Enigmatic World of Drama-Explained” with Dr.M.Murali Ganam, Professor and Head of M.A. English Programme, DG Vaishnav College, Chennai. The distinguished speaker said that of all

the genres of literature, drama proves to be most effective as it is a life like representation of the world; and he traced the growth and development of drama. The speaker made an observation in his talk that morality and religious plays based on the Biblical themes paved the way for the growth of drama when the religious priests wanted to preach morality to people particularly to the people of lower strata who were not educated enough to read the Bible and learn lessons from it, they staged plays interwoven with spiritual themes for the benefit of the simple illiterate folk.

In course of his discourse, Dr.Murali Ganam referred to Aristotle’s concept of “catharsis” which is nothing but the purification of the feelings of pity and fear. When the spectators behold a play particularly tragedy, the guest speaker quoting from Aristotle’s Poetics, illustrated that they will go through purification of emotions and emerge as far better mortals.

The subsequent parts of the discourse cast light on the popularity and immortality of British drama for which the contributions of Ben Jonson, Marlowe, William Shakespeare Dryden, T.S.Eliot, George Bernard Shaw and others made enormous contribution. The erudite eminent guest of honour articulated that Shakespeare with the publication of 37 plays including the immortal tragedies, Macbeth, Othello, King Lear and Hamlet is considered to be the father of English Drama.

Over and above, Dr.M.Murali Ganam drew the attention of the audience to the glory of ancient Indian dramas the manifestation of which can be found in the dramas of Kalidasa. His Plays Sakuntala, Kumarasambavam, Megathoodham and others have not only attained immortality but also earned him the title “The Shakespeare of India”. The eminent guest speaker further added that although Kalidasa belongs to 4th century BC and the phenomena of Shakespeare happened only



in 16th century AD, critics equate the former on a par with the latter. After that, the guest speaker's discourse centered around the contemporary dramatic domain wherein the plays of Vijay Tendulkar, Mahesh Dattani and others are found. The kernel part of his discourse was the analysis of the themes and stylistic features of the western and eastern dramas.

Prior to the commencement of the discourse, Dr.P.Madhan, Professor and Head, Department of English and Foreign Languages, welcomed the gathering and delivered the introductory address. In the end, Dr. S. Sudha, Assistant Professor of English, proposed a formal vote of thanks.

### Special Discourse on Post Modernism



The Department of English and Foreign Languages held a special discourse on “Post Modernism” on 11th March 2021 with Prof. K.Chellappan as the guest of honour. The Former Head of the Department of English, Bharadhidasan University, Trichy explained in detail all key characteristics of Post Modernism. He said that some critics view it as a “Period Concept” and some other critics look at it as a “unique genre.” He added further that if it is perceived as a “Period Concept”, it can be both the continuation and contradiction of modernism. Even if modernism is followed by post modernism, the latter is different from the former in its approach towards human life the manifestation of which is found in literature. Modernism mourns the disorderliness, fragmentation, chaos and incoherence of modern life. The octogenarian professor

referred to T.S.Eliot's “The Waste Land” as a land mark work of modernism wherein the poet grieves for the disorderly, chaotic, untidy and fragmented lives of moderns. But, the speaker said when modernism seeks to create order out of disorder, coherence out of incoherence, tidiness out of untidiness, and perfection out of chaos, Post Modernism celebrates disorder, incoherence, untidiness and chaos and it accepts them as part of life. Further, the distinguished speaker referred to Canadian Academic, Linda Hutcheon who opines that post modernism can be viewed as a blend of historiography and metafiction. Historiography is about recording the actual historical events whereas metafiction is concerned with fictionality of fiction. The speaker illustrated that Post Modernism is a blend of fact and fiction, adding that it reduces history to a kind of textuality and problematises it. In this regard, Prof.K.Chellappan, in his discourse brought out the post modern elements from Salman Rushdie's Midnight's Children wherein the protagonist Saleem Sinai associates his life with the history of India. Furthering his discourse, he articulated that magic realism which is an exaggerated version of realism is a key feature of Post Modernism. In addition to students, research scholars, faculty members from University English Department, Teachers and Students from the neighboring Alagappa Govt. Arts College also participated in the programme.

In the beginning of the programme, Dr.P.Madhan, Professor and Head, Department of English and Foreign Languages delivered the welcome address and finally Dr. SP. M. Kanimozhi proposed a formal vote of thanks.

### World Poetry Day Celebrations

In keeping with the tradition of observing UN (United Nations) declared World Poetry Day that falls on 21st March every year, this year also the Department celebrated World Poetry Day on 19th March 2021 through



online mode with the resource persons Prof. Navaneethan, Former Head of the Department of English, H.H. THE Rajah's College, Pudukottai and Former Professor of Tamil Dr. Valliammai from Annamalai University. One of the Guests of Honour, Prof. Navaneethan who spoke about English poetry defined poetry in the following way: The Identity of a race is Language, the identity of Language is Literature and the heart of Literature is Poetry, he further illustrated that the heart beat of a society can be heard in its poetry. Besides, dwelling on the profundity of Poetry, he stated that Poetry has the potential to bring about transformation and metamorphosis in people. Prof. Navaneethan's further articulation included the fact that back in the day, in the days of yore, only poetic pieces which were available in the forms of proverbs and sayings educated and enlightened the masses. In this regard, Prof. Navaneethan made a reference to the following definition of Shelley: Poets are the unacknowledged legislators of mankind. He made a mention about the following definitions of poetry by Wordsworth and Coleridge, with the former saying that "Poetry is spontaneous overflow of powerful feelings and it is emotions recollected in tranquility and the latter's statement "a poets mind is not like a mirror but a lamp because it not only imitates reality that also creates reality." The Guest of Honour also explained how T.S.Eliot's statement that poetry is not the expression of emotions but an escape from emotion differs from that of Wordsworth. Over and above, he made a survey of the growth and development of British Poetry and cast light on both romanticists and classicists. His lecture was followed by the discourse of Prof. Valliammai who painted a picture of the glory and greatness of Sangam Tamil poetry. She illustrated that through Sangam Tamil poetry the way of life, culture, civilization, love, warfare and agricultural practices of ancient Tamils can be learnt. She called Elangovadikal's Silapadhikaram the first ever national linguistic epic.

The PG and research students of the Department and faculty members attended the programmes. In the start of the programme, Dr.P.Madhan Professor and Head, Department of English and Foreign Languages, welcomed the gathering and Dr. M. Natarajan, proposed a formal vote of thanks in the end.

stunting the natural growth besides causing untold suffering. Girls who under went this agony alone were considered for married life. Unlike in the U.K. and France, Indian women were given voting rights as early as 1920.

Dr. Appachi Sabapathy, an eloquent orator, was the special guest and in his speech the speaker highlighted the necessity of celebrating Women's Day every year to recall and remember the achievements of women who in spite of social constraints could contribute substantially to the progress of the family, society and nation. He exhorted women to be courageous and oppose all oppressive attempts indulged in the patriarchal world. At the event the students of the Department of Theatre and Filma Studies enacted a play showing how atrocities were perpetrated on women in the society in the past and how much progress they have made now. The play received the applause of the audience.

## DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

### Human Rights Day Observed

The distinguished speaker concluded his speech by saying that the social reformers' contribution to the cause of social equity could be discerned by a study of social history of India.

## DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

### Chhatrapati Shivaji's 391st Birth Anniversary Celebrations

Chhatrapati Shivaji's 391st Birth Anniversary was celebrated at the Department of History, Alagappa University, Karaikudi, through virtual mode on 19th February, 2021. Vice-Chancellor Prof.N.Rajendran, in his presidential address, summarized Shivaji's remarkable achievements and contributions to the making of the Maratha Kingdom. With the assistance of a disciplined military and well-structured administrative organizations, Shivaji set up a professional and egalitarian civil law. The Vice-Chancellor asked the History Department to celebrate and recall the contributions of many other nation-builders to raise awareness among the student community on the unique leadership qualities of eminent historical personages.

Dr.Prabha Ravi Shankar, Associate Professor, PG. Dept. of History, Mahila College, Affiliated to SNTD Women's University, Mumbai, stated in her special address that how Shivaji taught religious tolerance, co-existence

and responsibility to his people. She also recollected how Shivaji learnt in his childhood to admire his mother; and he naturally developed reverence for women. She also referred to the remarkable research of historian Jadunath Sarkar and exhorted the participants to read the classic work Shivaji and His Times. She also mentioned that the Maharashtra State Archives holds a vast collection of about 14 crore records including letters by Chhatrapati Shivaji to his son Sambhaji etc.

Dr.AR.Saravanakumar, Head (i/c), Department of History, Alagappa University, welcomed the participants and Dr.G.Paranthaman, Assistant Professor, Department of History, proposed a vote of thanks.

### National Symposium on India's Independence

A National Symposium on India's Independence was conducted virtually on 12 March 2021 at the Department of History, Alagappa University, Karaikudi as a prelude for the grand celebrations planned to mark 75 Years of India's Independence in August, 2022. Murugan, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Alagappa University, while welcoming the participants, said that the "Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav" has commenced exactly 75 weeks prior to the 75th Independence Day that falls in 2022 and would extend up to the Independence Day 2023 and the Mahotsav will help the young generation to get inspiration and imbibe the spirit of patriotism.

Vice-Chancellor

Prof.N.Rajendran,



in his presidential address, referring to the Salt Satyagraha, mentioned that it was an epic march in the history of India. Gandhi's participation in this event made it a mass movement and the TIME magazine understanding the significance of Gandhi's participation declared him as "Person of the Year" in 1930 and it also described him as 'Saint Gandhi'. He mentioned the remarkable Subaltern Studies made by the historian Ranajit Guha and asked the historians to record the sacrifices and struggles of unsung freedom fighters. He also stressed the notable role of Tamil Nadu in the freedom struggle and recollected the great contributions of leaders like Subramania Bharathi, V.O.Chidambaram and others.

Prof. G. Chandrika, Professor, Department of History, Pondicherry University, delivered the special address on the theme titled "Role of Women in the Salt Satyagraha". She said that Gandhi strongly believed that women are stronger than men. She also mentioned the passionate participation of women in the Salt Satyagraha March spanning 240 miles from Sabarmati Ashram to Dandi which drew the attention of the nation. She listed out the contributions of eminent women such as Sarojini Naidu, Kasthurba Gandhi, Muthulakshmi Reddy etc.

Dr.Prabha Ravi Shankar, Associate Professor, PG. Dept. of History, Mahila College, Affiliated to SNTD Women's University, Mumbai, spoke on the topic "Mahatma Jyotirao Phule and Savitribhai Phule: Extraordinary Couple and Social Reformers of Maharashtra". She stated that Jyotirao Phule is extolled as the champion of women's education in India. He, along with his wife Savitribai Phule, opened the first school for girls in 1848. Both dedicated their entire lives for the uplift of the down-trodden and for eradication of untouchability. They strove for equal rights for all.

Dr.S.Anantha Krishnan, Associate

Professor & HOD, Department of History, A.M.Jain College, Chennai, gave a speech on the topic "Gandhiji: Passive Resistance as a Weapon". He mentioned that Gandhi was greatly influenced by Leo Tolstoy's book, The Kingdom of God is Within You and his essay on "Christianity and Patriotism" and also said how Gandhi was influenced by Thoreau's master treatise "Civil Disobedience"

Prof. S. Rajavelu, Adjunct Faculty, Department of History, Alagappa University, proposed a vote of thanks.

### Collection of Antiquities Obtained from Elanthakarai Village Given to University



The Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Prof. N. Rajendran received a collection of antiquities obtained from Elanthakarai, a village near Kalaiyarkoyil, Sivagangai District from an enthusiast Mr.K.Ramesh who is a resident of Kalaiyarkoyil. Prof. N. Rajendran said these antiquities are the landmark findings revealing the history of Tamil Nadu spanning a period from the Sangam Age to the Medieval Period.

Prof.N.Rajendran said that on the basis of these collections, the Department of History of Alagappa University has made a preliminary survey of this site and collected a few artifacts and found the site having a great potential to do further investigation. It is proposed to start the excavation during 2020-21. The proposal for this purpose was sent to Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi through the Government of Tamil Nadu. The Standing Committee



of Central Advisory Board of Archaeology,(CABA) has now approved the proposal for taking up the excavation work at Elanthakarai with the co-operation of Archaeological Survey of India. The Archaeological Survey of India is to join the University for the first time to do excavations in Tamil Nadu. The Department of Archaeology, Government of Tamil Nadu, is providing full cooperation for this work. An MoU has already been signed by the University with the Tamil Nadu Government's Archaeology Department to do archaeological excavations, explorations and researches through the History Department of Alagappa University.

The Department of History, under the direction of Prof. S. Rajavelu, Adjunct Faculty, Dr. AR. Saravanakumar, Head i/c and Dr. Paranthaman with a team of archaeologists from Archaeological Survey of India is to begin the excavation work soon. The Archaeological Survey of India will nominate one Co-director for this project. The Vice-Chancellor said: "After seeing the large number of antiquities and potteries collected from Elanthakarai through surface level explorations, we hope our excavation certainly will give fruitful results and this site will be yet another significant site like Keeladi site in Sivagangai District to learn about the authentic history of the Tamils".

"The antiquities which we have received from Mr.K.Ramesh consisting of various kinds of beads, punch marked coins of 4th or 3rd century BCE., Ceylon man type coin of Rajaraja Chola, variety of potteries, bone objects, terracotta figurines, hopscotches clearly indicate the site at Elanthakarai has great potential for excavation. The exploration will throw more light on the ancient culture and history of the Tamils".

"Today we have also received nearly 500 inscriptional estampages which were taken by an Epigraphist Karu. Rajendran from the districts of Pudukkottai and Sivagangai for preserving them at the proposed Museum

at our University Campus. We are going to display and preserve all these objects and inscriptions for the benefit of research students as well as general public interested in history and archaeology. In future, the Museum of the Department of History in our University will be made into a full-fledged Museum which would reflect the History and Culture of the Tamils," Prof. N. Rajendran added.

During this function Prof. S. Rajavelu, Adjunct faculty, Dr.KR.Murugan, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Dr.AR. Saravanakumar and other faculty members of the Department of History, were present. The Vice-Chancellor congratulated the donors Mr.K.Ramesh of Elanthakarai and Mr.Karu.Rajendran, Epigraphist of Melapanaiyur for evincing keen interest in historical research and also for their donation of valuable artifacts and inscriptions to the Department of History, Alagappa University.

#### **125th Birth Anniversary of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose**

The 125th Birth Anniversary of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose was celebrated as "Parakram Diwas" by the Department of History, Alagappa University, Karaikudi, on 23rd January, 2021. Vice-Chancellor Prof.N.Rajendran, in his presidential address, recapitulated Netaji's fight against the British rule in India and his contributions to the Indian Independence Movement. ### Themed Nobel Excellence Talk-2020 (AcT-NExT -2020)

The Department of Industrial Chemistry of Alagappa University organized a one day seminar entitled “Alagappa Celebrates

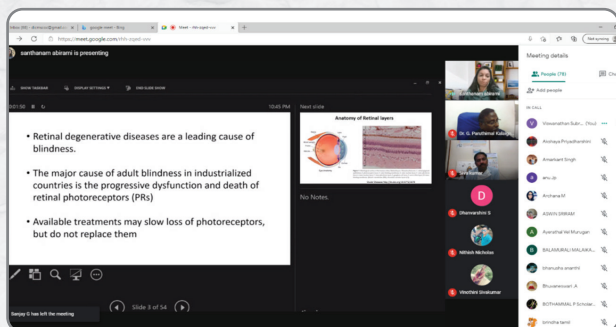
Themed Nobel Excellence Talk-2020 (AcT-NExT -2020)” on 25th January 2021 through virtual mode. The aim of the seminar was to motivate the young postgraduate students and Ph.D. scholars to take up quality research. This conference focused on the latest scientific research and development in the field of chemistry.

Dr. G. Paruthimal Kalaigan, Senior Professor & Head, Department of Industrial Chemistry delivered the welcome address. Vice-Chancellor Prof. N. Rajendran delivered the presidential address. He said that the Nobel Laureates Emmanuelle Charpentier and American biochemist Jennifer A. Doudna of the University of California, Berkeley, were awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry -2020 “for the development of a method for genome editing” and emphasized the importance of science research to the young researchers and asked them to concentrate on research in health sciences. Students and research scholars should take up high quality research that could support the overall scientific development and he advised the researchers to publish in Scopus-Indexed journals and books. “An in-depth knowledge of the specific field of research chosen by the scholar is a must for turning out quality reports or thesis,” he said.

### Invited Talks Delivered

Dr. S. Abirami, Scientist, The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, USA, delivered an invited talk on the topic “Enabling Blind People See Again”. She explained the research methods to diagnose and eliminate hereditary eye defects. She highlighted the recent development in photoreceptor regeneration studies. She discussed the Retinitis Pigmentosa (RP) which is a genetically-based retinal degenerative disease which causes the death of rod photoreceptors and progressive vision loss, leading to blindness in many patients. RP





affects about 1 in 4000 people in the US. The steady march to blindness is a result of the failure of mammalian retina to produce an effective regenerative response to the presence of disease or injury. This, however, is not the case in teleost fish. Fish are able to produce all types of retinal neurons following an injury, and represent a valuable model system to study the mechanisms of regeneration. Her talk focused on understanding the transcriptional programmes that control proliferation of progenitor cells and their differentiation to produce photoreceptors which will allow the development of genetic therapies to reprogramme mammalian cells to undergo a productive regenerative response.

Dr. C. Sivakumar, Principal Scientist, Electrode & Electrocatalysis Division, Central Electrochemical Research Institute, delivered a talk on the significance of conducting polymers and its utilization in the field of chemical or electrocatalysis, drug delivery, sensor, supercapacitor etc. He described the fabrication of nanostructured conducting composites via the incorporation of precious or non-precious metal nanocatalysts / metal oxides. Reduced graphene oxide also enhances its electrocatalytic activity, sensing capability and electro transfer kinetics etc. With rational design and synthesis, conducting polymer with controllable morphologies and physicochemical properties can exhibit fascinating electrocatalytic, sensing and biological properties. This presentation overviewed on the novel synthetic methodology with the relationship of morphology, property of conducting polymer support and their recent

advances in electro catalytic, electrochemical bio sensing and energy storage/conversion applications.

Senior Professor Dr S. Karuthapandian spoke on “CRISPR-Cas9 and The Nobel Prize in Chemistry- 2020”. He explained that, genetic scissors are a tool for rewriting the code of life. Emmanuelle Charpentier and Jennifer A. Doudna have discovered one of gene technology’s sharpest tools: the CRISPR/Cas9 genetic scissors. Using these, researchers can change the DNA of animals, plants and microorganisms with extremely high precision. This technology will have a revolutionary impact on the life sciences and it is contributing to new cancer therapies and may make the dream of curing inherited diseases come true. Researchers need to modify genes in cells if they are to find out life’s inner workings. This may be time-consuming, difficult and sometimes impossible work. Using the CRISPR/Cas9 genetic scissors, it is now possible to change the code of life over the course of a few weeks. CRISPR-Cas9 is a unique technology that enables geneticists and medical researchers to edit parts of the genome by removing, adding or altering sections of the DNA sequence. It is currently the simplest, most versatile and precise method of genetic manipulation and is therefore causing a buzz in the science world “There is enormous power in this genetic tool, which affect us all. It has not only revolutionised basic science, but also resulted in innovative crops and will lead to ground-breaking new medical treatments,” says Dr S. Karuthapandian.

Dr. A. Subbiah made a detailed discussion on electrochemical sensor/biosensor and its applications. He explained different allotropes of carbon used as the electrode materials for various sensing applications.

Dr. S. Viswanathan, Assistant Professor, Department of Industrial Chemistry, Alagappa University delivered the vote of thanks. Nearly



one hundred participants actively participated in this one-day Seminar on AcT-NExT -2020.

In the past 22 years, he has developed several multifunctional photocatalytic nanocomposites for hydrogen fuel production and to treat industrial wastewaters

## DEPARTMENT OF BIOINFORMATICS

### SEARCHING FOR TARGET-SPECIFIC AND MULTI-TARGETING ORGANICS FOR COVID-19 IN THE DRUGBANK DATABASE WITH A DOUBLE SCORING APPROACH

The Covid-19 outbreak is spreading alarmingly and number of deaths is also increasing every day in some parts of the world. Collaborative research and mobilization

of scientific skills is needed to address the COVID-19 challenge. In continuation to collaborative research culture, Professor J. Jeyakanthan, Professor & Head, Department of Bioinformatics, Alagappa University and Dr. Doc. N. Arul Murugan Docent of the Department of Theoretical Chemistry and Biology, School of Engineering Sciences in Chemistry, Biotechnology and Health KTH Royal Institute of Technology, Stockholm, Sweden have refocused their research work to support frontline efforts in identifying the potent phytochemicals to treat Covid-19 infections.

They have proposed a list of individual drugs and cocktails that deserve testing in clinical environment for treatment of COVID-19 and the results are published in Scientific Reports (<https://doi.org/10.1038/s41598-020-75762-7>). The researchers have proposed a reliable double scoring approach to computationally screen lead drug-like compounds from DrugBank database against the most important SARS-CoV-2 viral targets namely 3C-like protease (3CLpro), papain-like protease (PLpro), RNA-dependent RNA polymerase (RdRp) and the spike (S) protein which play a major role in viral replication and human cell recognition. They have identified a variety of as-yet-unexplored ways to attack COVID-19, in addition to proposing drug cocktails namely Baloxavir marboxil, Natamycin and RU85053 that can simultaneously inhibit multiple viral proteins based on binding free energies implemented in AutoDock Vina and molecular mechanics—generalized Born surface area approaches. SARS-CoV-2 is a rapidly mutating positive single strand RNA virus with as many as 12000 mutations reported till now including a key mutation D614G. Therefore this multi-targeting ability of drugs offers an effective route to deal with drug resistance which enables the drugs to work around the viral mutations. Accordingly if a drug that can target several proteins and if one viral protein becomes mutated, the drug



can still be effective on other viral proteins. This is the potency of multitargeting drugs and drugs cocktails proposed in this article. In addition, the researchers have identified a few compounds such as Phthalocyanine, Tadalafil, Lonafarnib, Nilotinib, Dihydroergotamine and R-428 which can bind to all the specified viral targets simultaneously and can serve as multi-targeting drugs. Further, their study also includes the binding energy estimation for various compounds which are currently under drug trials. It is shown that Remdesivir binds to RdRp and 3CLpro with high binding affinity indicating that it can be categorized as a multi-targeting drug. Baricitinib and Umifenovir are found to be compounds with superior target-specific binding while Darunavir is found again to be a multitargeting drug. Double scoring approach also explains why some drugs like hydroxychloroquine and Oseltamivir are not very active against any of the viral targets and in particular, the former compound has only moderate binding affinity or inhibition potential towards RdRp. Among the drugs that the study recommends for testing are Tivantinib, Olaparib, Zoliflodacin, Golvatinib, Sonidegib, Regorafenib and PCO-371. The paper also provides a listing of multi-targeting drugs such as DB04016, Phthalocyanine and Tadalafil which can also be effective in combating the rapidly mutating coronavirus.

### World Fisheries Day

As part of the celebrations of World Fisheries Day, the Department of Fisheries Science of Alagappa University organized a National Webinar on “Next Generation Technology for Sustainable Fisheries” in collaboration with Department of Animal Health and Management, on 21st November, 2020. More than 400 participants from different institutions of India, China, Egypt and Angola and professionals from aquaculture industry registered for the webinar.

In his welcome address, Dr. E. Kannapiran, Professor and Head, Department of Fisheries Science, highlighted the importance of World Fisheries Day and stated that every year on 21st November the day is celebrated by fisher-folk communities throughout the world to proclaim to humanity the significance of healthy oceans and eco-systems for ensuring sustainable stocks of fish in the world.

Prof. N. Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, outlined the problems encountered in fisheries owing to climate change, overexploitation and illegal fishing activities which led to depletion of wild fish population. He stressed upon the importance of increasing women employment in fisheries sector. NASSCOM has reported that India alone would need one million cyber security professionals in a couple of years, while job portals have reported a spike of 150 percent in cyber security job roles. Considering the need, Alagappa University has made yet another achievement by roping in a Cyber Security Startup to establish a R&D Centre in the University. Through this venture, skill training, R&D and consultancy services are to be provided to the academia and industries”. He added that the University aims to create a skilled workforce for strengthening the R&D culture in Cyber Security in collaboration with industries. This is done to further the initiatives



of the Central and State Governments on Cyber Security”.

Elocution and Essay-writing competitions were conducted online for the students of University and Affiliated Colleges and the winners were given prizes and certificates.

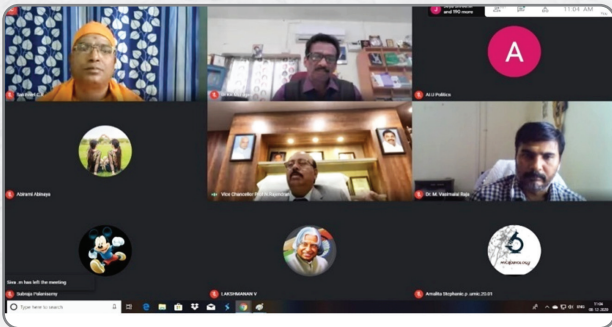
#### **Refresher Course Conducted for Voulnteer-Student Co-ordinators of Swami Vivekananda Centre**

The Placement Cell of the University has signed two MoUs for conducting mega campus drive for the benefit of passed out students and present final year students of the University departments and affiliated colleges.

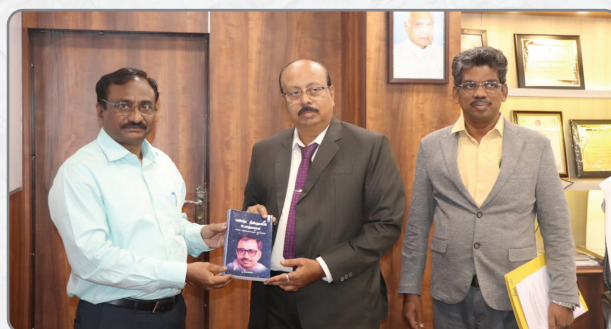
The first MOU was entered between the University Placement Cell and TVS Training and Services Ltd Chennai on 02.02.2021.

## PT. DEENDAYAL UPADHYAY CHAIR OF ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY

### National Webinar on Relevance of Integral Humanism in the Present Context



In commemoration of the death anniversary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay, a National Webinar on ‘Relevance of Integral Humanism in the Present Context’ was organized on 11th February 2021 by the Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Chair of Alagappa University. As part of this national webinar, a book ‘Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay: Bharathiya Ideologies and Contributions’ written in Tamil language by the Chair Professor Prof. B. Dharmalingam was released by Prof. Bhagawati Prakash Sharma, Vice-Chancellor of Gautam Buddha University, Noida. Prof. N. Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, received the first copy from the author.

In his presidential address, Prof. N. Rajendran, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University said, “India has rich traditional and cultural history across the centuries. Indian



civilization is one among the two oldest and still living civilizations in the globe. Ever since the starting, our civilization and cultural ethos are focused only on transforming the individuals and upholding our value system. In the middle, due to colonial impact, we lost our value system and did not respect ancient heritage. Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay was a forerunner to bring new impactful thinking revolution in India. Till his last breath, Panditji propagated so many India-centric and societal development ideologies collectively called as Integral Humanism that focuses on the development of individuals. He proposed a great development model 'Antyodaya'. Literally, 'Antyodaya' means the 'rise of the last person'. The Integral Humanism principles are the proven solutions for the contemporary cultural, economic and political problems faced by the humankind."

In his inaugural address, Prof. Bhagawati Prakash Sharma, Vice-Chancellor of Gautam Buddha University, Noida said, "From the colonial period and after independence we have tried several economic models. Most of the economic models are imbibed with western culture and they may not be suitable for the Indian context. This is the major root cause of the current economic crisis. All these unsuitable development models focused only on the materials and not on transforming the individuals and thereby the society. Deendayal Upadhyay always believed that the measurement of economic plans and economic growth cannot be done with those who have reached the heights of the economic ladder but with those who are at the bottom. This is what Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay propagated through his Integral Humanism. Panditji was a profound philosopher, organiser par excellence and a great leader who maintained the highest standards of personal integrity; he has been

the source of ideological guidance and moral inspiration for alternate thinking on the basis of Indian culture."

Shri. N. Srinivasan, Senior Advocate and Social Activist, Madurai offered his felicitations. Prof. B. Dharmalingam, Chair Professor, Pt.
